Pastor Jeff shared the 2023 Daily Texts devotional. Patience was the basis of today's devotion, followed with gratitude.

Dan made a motion to approve the minutes. Bill seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

Pastor Jeff gave his report. Christmas Eve had about 50 more people in attendance than last year. Christmas Day was over 85 in attendance. Additional events held in December were Light Up the Night, weekly Advent, Cantata, Paul Rolette. Bill Moberly will be coming in January. January 12-15 Pastor will be gone. Jeff Johnson is filling the pulpit. Dennis Nelson will be handling adult education in January. Get Connected class is coming January 22 after second service.

Dottie gave her report on Missions/Outreach team. Eileen Doench shared the Missions budget for 2023. After an audit, they found an additional \$24,000. This surplus will be carried into 2023. Dennis made a motion to accept the budget. Dan seconded. All were in favor. Motion was carried. Full report is attached.

Dennis Johnson gave his report on Worship & Education Ministries. Full report is attached.

Dan Beck shared his report for Property. Full report is attached. Fire extinguishers were checked last Thursday by ADT. Majority of them failed. New fire extinguishers will have to be purchased.

Bill Gest gave an update on the November finances. Donna made a motion to gift \$1000 to LCMC. Dottie seconded. All were in favor. Motion was carried. Simple Giving charges 4% fee for the online offering. Zelle is no charge, but requires an email to be set up. Bill will set up offering@sothaz.com for using with Zelle. We also discussed setting up a Venmo account.

Debbie gave an update on the office. What are we planned for a sound technician? We need to approve the job description. Matthew Frable, Sue Boyle and Pastor Jeff will interview. The revised job description will be approved via email or zoom meeting. This position is still considered a contract position. We received a premium notice for additional auto policy coverage with an annual fee of \$250 which Debbie wanted to know if we should pay the premium. We do have a \$1 million umbrella insurance policy. Debbie will check if umbrella covers autos.

The 2023 budget was reviewed by Bill Gest. Dottie made a motion to approve the 2023 budget for congregation approval at the annual meeting. Sue seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion was carried. The annual congregation meeting approves the budget the end of January. Entering the budget after the new year begins, causes issues with Portico benefits, taxes, salaries, etc. To eliminate these issues, Bill made a motion that we start the salary increase payments effective January 1 based on the 2023 budget anticipating approval of the budget at the annual meeting. Dennis seconded. All were in favor. Motion was carried.

An agenda was created for the annual meeting. Sue made a motion to accept the annual meeting agenda. Bill seconded. All were in favor. Motion was approved. Annual reports are due to Debbie on January 12, 2023.

Exec meeting, January 17. Regular meeting, January 24. Dan made motion to adjourn. Sue Seconded. All in Favor. Motion Carried. The meeting was closed with The Lord's Prayer.

Church Repairs

Dan Beck:

- Replaced the high pressure flusher in the ED women's toilet
- The Flag was replaced and the old one was taken to the fire station. They will make sure it is taken to the VFW for proper disposal.
- All the air filters were changed out on the air handlers.
- There is a problem with water getting into the storage area behind the office when it rains really hard. The water soaks into the ground, near the choir door entry, and follows the cold air return to get in. Bad design of the building. We need to move the gravel, build up the dirt, cover the dirt with plastic so the water drains away from this area, then cover the plastic with the gravel. Or, figure out how to drain the water away from the building by putting a drain under the side walk. Lloyd believers we can adjust the slop of the roof gutter and have only one downspout that would drain in the rose garden.
- We are having a lot of issues with the church doors not closing properly. When the team is checking the doors at night, they can pull some of the doors open. The door latches are not properly latching either on the top or bottom of the door frames.

This budget proposal has been done without December tithings. Some missions were decreased but these missions will be reevaluated in 2023 to give one-time gifts to those the team feels should be increased.
